Introduction

This Handbook introduces **BSc Business Studies** and **BBA** students in LUMS to opportunities available to study abroad. It needs to be read in conjunction with the Study Abroad Notes of Guidance produced for their programme, available from **Jacqui Wright** (Room A5, LUMS) for **Business Studies** and **Clare Edwards** (Room A11, LUMS) for the **BBA**.

We would normally expect students to spend the whole of their second year **or** the first term of their final year at one of these partner institutions. These arrangements ALWAYS need to be approved by your Programme Director and the Study Abroad advisor in relevant departments. The courses taken on an exchange need to be very similar to the courses that you would have taken if you had stayed in Lancaster for the full degree. **Please note that students are not normally able to undertake their Study Abroad in their home country – the main purpose of this opportunity is to give students the experience of a new culture and environment.**

This handbook contains information about LUMS exchange partners and Lancaster University partners. The contacts for further information and for application procedures are different, depending on the institution. Please see individual entries for further information.

Please note, in relation to tuition fees:

1. If **UK students spend a full year** in an EU partner institution on the Erasmus programme their tuition fees are waived. **However please note** that this is under review.
2. **International and EU students** currently pay half fees to Lancaster when they spend a full year in an EU country
3. **All students who spend a full academic year** in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, USA, Thailand or Taiwan are charged half of the relevant tuition fee
4. **All students who spend a term or semester** studying at a partner institution overseas pay full fees to Lancaster.

Introduction

Peking University is internationally recognized as one of the top two Universities in China. Copenhagen Business School (HHK) consists of 29 Institutes or departments, located in seven buildings in the centre of this small and beautiful capital city. Visas

Non- EU students need to secure visas for this placement. This can be problematic so it is necessary to make applications **as early as possible**.

Number of places: maximum 2.

Language Requirements

The teaching language in Denmark is English, and this is also used for social purposes by many people. It is therefore not necessary to be able to speak or read Danish

This is likely to be a full year exchange, running from September 2009 until May/June April 2010 and UK/EU students qualify for Erasmus funding support.

WHU Koblenz is a small private university located in a beautiful Rhineland setting 60 miles north of Frankfurt. Founded in 1984, it is one of only 3 private universities in Germany, all of which specialise in Management. It is a Business School, which as a consequence of its selectivity, its private status and its highly developed international network, is, in terms of its teaching programme, one of the most highly reputed in the country. Athens University of Economics and Business was founded more than 85 years ago, and has always been in the forefront of education and research. It has produced by far the largest number of industry leaders, entrepreneurs, civil servants, and managers, as well as faculty members and researchers in its fields, and has thus played a key role in the development of the country.

With 8 undergraduate programs, 24 graduate (Master's) programs, a strong Doctoral program, 32 research laboratories, a world-recognized faculty and an excellent pool of students, AUEB offers an excellent environment to learn and do research. At the same time, the University offers many opportunities for cultural or athletic activities, as well as participation in student unions or student organizations.

Their exchange program is also particularly strong. Through the Erasmus program, every year about 220 AUEB undergraduate students leave our campus to spend a semester or a year to a University in another European country, while 270 students from international Universities come to spend an equivalent time at AUEB, thus rendering AUEB the "most per-capita-intensive" exchange program in Greece. Chulalongkorn University, Thailand's first institution of higher learning, officially came into being in March, 1917. The groundwork and preparation for it in terms of planning and development, however, took place more than a century ago. The worldwide economic, social and political changes in the late nineteenth century contributed to Siam's decision to adapt herself in order to avoid being colonized by the Western powers ("Siam" became "Thailand" in the year 1939). As a result, a University was founded in 1871 at the Royal Pages Barrack within the Grand Palace compound.

Since these early days, the development of the University has continued. In 1961 the university set up the Graduate School to be responsible for graduate level education and since then the focus has been on graduate education and research centres have been set up.
